



Summer Term Week 3 Activities

1. <https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/topics/zgssgk7/articles/zyv3jty> Use the link to find out about the life cycle of a plant. Use words and diagrams to explain what you have found out.
2. Calming exercise. Close your eyes and sit comfortably with your back straight. As you sit there spend some time observing your breathing. Feel the in breath and watch what happens when you breath back out. As you sit there try to make your breaths longer. Take a longer breath in and then breath out slowly and gently. As you breath out feel as if all of your worries and problems are blowing away, leaving you feeling relaxed and calm. Repeat this a few times.
3. If you have done the Kahoot on Thursday 30th this should be easy. Write a definition of human and physical geographical features. Give examples of both.
4. When you go on your daily walk do a tally chart of human and physical features. You could look for cars, trees and gates.
5. Use the website link to write instructions for how to plant a tree. <https://www.woodlandtrust.org.uk/plant-trees/advice/how-to-plant/>
6. If you can get hold of some seeds carry out a simple science experiment to find out what plants need to grow. Make sure you have one in four different conditions. You could have one at room temperature, one in the fridge, one in the dark and one in the light. Make sure that they all get watered so that they all have only one variable. What did you find out?
7. Watch both clips on the link to find out what pulse and rhythm are. Once you understand what they are, come up with a rhythm using parts of your body and your voice.
